## A City Council meeting worth attending

This Thursday night (February 9, at 7:30 pm), the City Council will vote on the final approval for the Castro Street Revitalization project. We *urge* you to attend this meeting to ensure that the Council is aware of residents' concerns regarding this major project. If you can't attend the meeting (which is held at the Fire Station, 1000 Villa), set your VCR to record it on Channel 27 of Hearst Cable TV.

## What do you think?

Over the last few weekends, we have been informally surveying residents of the area bounded by Castro, Evelyn, Calderon, and El Camino. Out of some 150 households visited, we've found that about 70% feel traffic is a problem that needs to be addressed. Nearly 90% would support some action to slow the flow of traffic even if it caused them some inconvenience. Significantly, about 50% support drastic traffic control measures such as diverters or changing some streets to one-way.

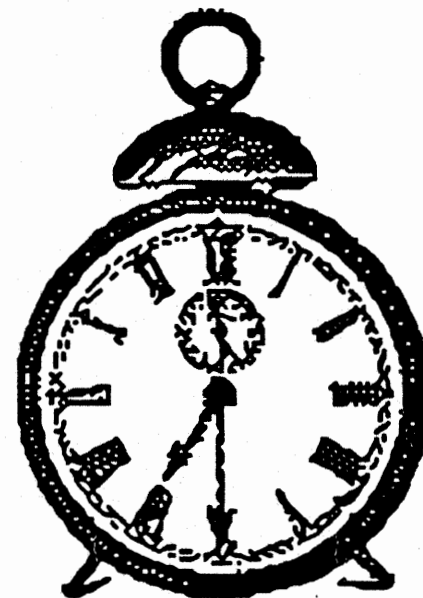
