- ☐ Replace
 - ☐ Older, medium-sized, naturally affordable apartment complexes with
 - Newer high-density luxury apartment complexes with below market-rate units
- ☐ This is
 - ☐ In addition to 11,135 units required by the state in the next 8 years
 - ☐ In spite of post-COVID California exodus
- ☐ Council will vote on R3 rezoning in 2023

R3-A: 2.5 to 3-4 stories

R3-B: 3.5 to 4-5 stories

R3-C: 3.5 to 5 stories

R3-D: 6 to 8-9 stories
